### From the Executive Director, Kaki Green

Once upon a time – 30 years ago – three gentlemen from Georgia crafted the idea to financially assist eligible Christian Science Sunday School students in their state so that they could attend a Christian Science camp. They named it “The Campership Fund for Christian Scientists in Georgia”. Little did they know what it would become, and how many it would bless.

Several years later, the fund extended to include Alabama, North and South Carolina, and Florida. The name was then changed to “The Campership Fund for Christian Scientists in the Southeast”. Soon After, more states were included and things quickly grew from there. The words “in the Southeast” were eliminated! In the ensuing

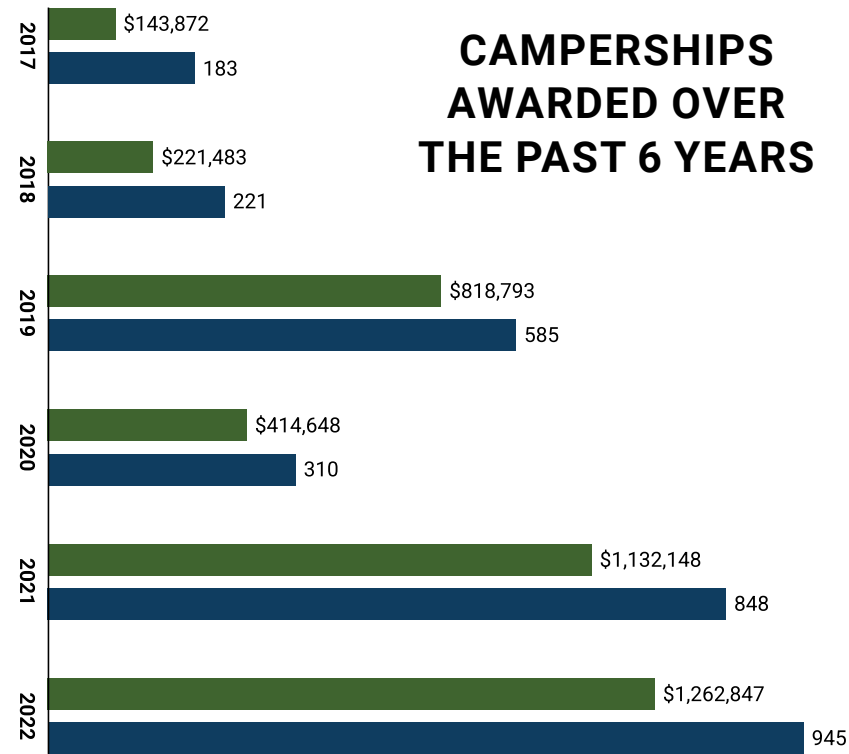
years, an organizational structure was put into place, representatives for each state were identified to promote TCF and process applications, and a social media marketing program was implemented. Throughout it all, campers and their families were experiencing the opportunity of a lifetime. Two years ago TCF extended their assistance to adult and family camp programs as well.

TCF all started with 10 or 12 kids from Georgia. It is now blessing hundreds of Christian Science children and adults from all across the United States and Canada, all because three men had a vision.

### Highlights of 2022

- ▶ Awarded \$1,262,847 camperships to 945 kids and adults. Included in the 945 campers are 31 loved ones from Rainbow Valley Resource Network.
- ▶ Supported 775 children and 170 adults.
- ▶ Helped 227 brand new campers attend camp.
- ▶ Had a successful spring and Giving Tuesday campaigns thanks to generous donors.
- ▶ Continued our Church Board outreach to build relationships and identify campers.
- ▶ Increased our Reps to 94 across the US and Canada.
- ▶ Supported several camp work weekends with our Reps.
- ▶ Increased engagement on social media due to our marketing efforts.
- ▶ Created our “1992 Legacy Society” for those investing in the sustainability of our mission.
- ▶ Held our First Annual Campership Giving Campaign which included all the camps.

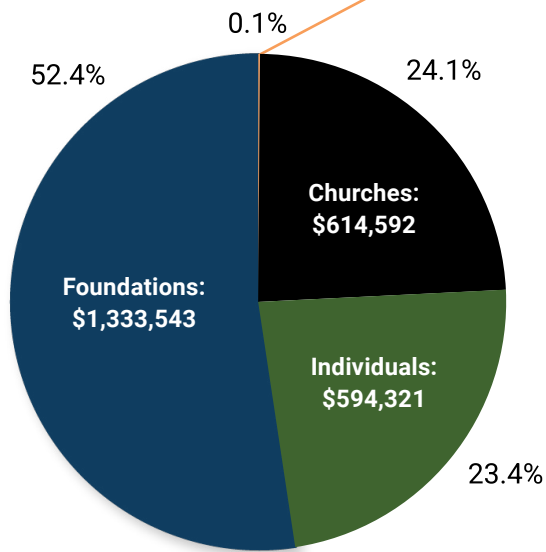


## CAMP STORIES FROM 2022:

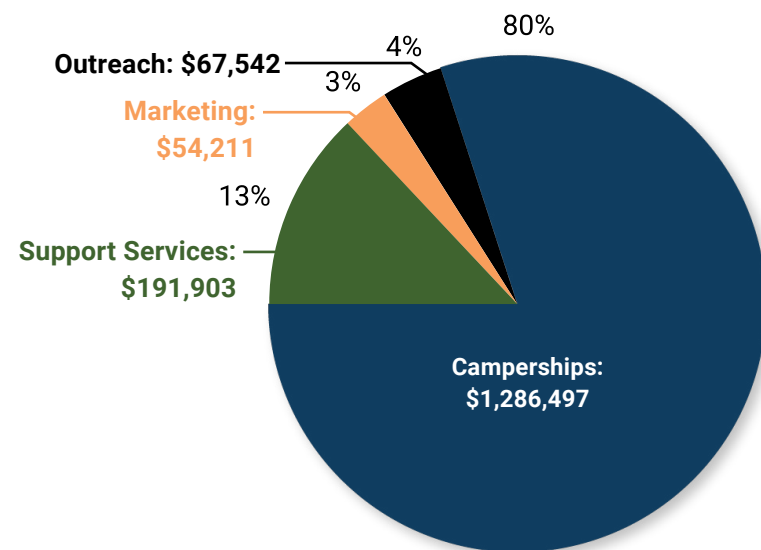
### Two Campers Helping Pay Their Way to Camp:

Our family is deeply grateful for the financial support to send our two children to CedarS Camp for two weeks. This was our 4th grader's first time going for two weeks and our 2nd grader's first time going (besides one Family Camp). They both had wonderful experiences and benefited from being around not only kids their own ages but also "big kid" counselors who are all learning the same truths about God and themselves as His reflections. I really appreciated the question in the application form regarding what the campers were doing to help send themselves to camp. Since they are so young, I hadn't thought about involving them in fundraising. We came up with two ways for them to contribute. First, they donated the money they made from selling toys they no longer wanted at a garage sale. Second, they wrote letters to family members asking for donations towards attending camp. We brought what they had collected to camp so they could pay their own balances. Thank you for inspiring us to have them take ownership of contributing to their camp experience. ### Healings at Camp:

# HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE STAFF:



## Outreach Program:

Reaching out and sharing information about the six camps for Christian Scientists and the funding available to get them there through two avenues—our TCF Representatives and TCF Outreach Events.

### *Our TCF Representatives*

#### **JACK KAVANAGH, OUTREACH DIRECTOR**

Our Representatives are camp lovers that help TCF live and implement our mission. Nearly 100 volunteers dedicate their time and spiritual insight to help us demonstrate supply.

Strategically, TCF’s outreach staff recruits and puts into action a Rep network to increase our presence and visibility to the Christian Science community. We frequently tell the Reps, “We couldn’t do this without you,” and we mean it. The Reps are our boots-on-the-ground, speaking with their fellow church members, hosting camp shows, and vetting applications. We research and enlist the Reps’ help in support of the camps by reaching out throughout their states and communities for new campers, more volunteers, and possible donors.

Here’s what our Reps did in 2022:

- ▶ Vetted applications for the 945 campership recipients.
- ▶ Attended camp shows to speak about TCF financial assistance helping new campers.
- ▶ Hosted virtual camp shows to recruit new campers from their churches.
- ▶ Volunteered at camp work weekends, preparing the camp facilities for summer.
- ▶ Volunteered as adult support during the summer programs.

Many of our Reps remember when they were campers, their first healing, when they met their lifelong best friend, and how the unique lessons they learned at camp shaped their



adult character. By volunteering with TCF, Reps have the opportunity to share these same blessings with those in financial need.

I have been honored to work with our TCF Representatives. Many see the camps as immersion schools for young people to learn spiritual healing. They embody selfless volunteering to help promote the cause of Christian Science for the next generation.

- ▶ Asking if they would consider sharing our emails with their church members.

This has been a fantastic opportunity to both connect and engage with churches across the country and help them connect with the Christian Science community.

We hosted several very well-attended virtual outreach events, with people joining from all over the United States and Canada. We have our hard-working TCF Reps to thank for gathering their church communities together to meet with us and learn about what camp has to offer children, adults, and families! The outreach team also enjoyed joining the camps for their virtual camp shows so that we could share about TCF and what we do. It was fun to see each camp's unique personality and creativity shine through the screen!

We also had some amazing opportunities to join programs such as DiscoveryBound for adult backpacking. We also joined clean-up weekends at A/U, CedarS, and Crystal Lake Camps this year. Members of the TCF staff enjoyed the opportunity to support the camps and spend time with TCF Reps in person at work weekends.

We remain extremely grateful for the opportunities focused on strengthening existing connections, making new ones, and developing new ways of reaching Christian Scientists in 2022.

### Applications Report for 2022

The Campership Fund and donors were able to assist with sending 945 campers to Christian Science camp programs during the 2022 season. In total, TCF awarded \$1,262,846 in camperships. The Campership Fund supported all six of the Christian Science camps for summer youth camp and family and adult programs, as well as first year National Leadership Council (NLC) camp experiences and Rainbow Valley Resource Network (RVRN) camp programming. (RVRN supports Christian Scientists with developmental and special needs.)

TCF supported 227 first-time or new campers (24% of all applicants). From the following table, the number of campers supported at each camp program can be seen.

The deadline was reinstated for summer youth camp applications with a date of May 31, 2022. This was helpful for the processing and approval of summer camp applications.

The Campership Fund received applications from 44 states including Washington, DC and four Canadian provinces. The Canadian provinces include British Columbia, Manitoba, Ontario, and Quebec. States with more than 30 applications can be seen in the following table.

#### Social Media

##### Instagram:

The Campership Fund just finished our second full year on Instagram! We continued to see positive growth in followers and engagement rate, and Instagram continues to be our leading force in engagement with camp alumni and parents.

- ▶ Followers (as of December 31): 506 (a 77% increase from 2021).
- ▶ Engagement: 4,791 post likes, comments, and shares (up 20% from 2021).



## Facebook:

The Campership Fund for Christian Scientists Facebook page was created in 2010 to cover the Southeast and Midwest and was revitalized in February of 2020 when we began covering all 50 states. In the past 2 years, we have reached nearly 10,000 people on the platform.

As of December 31, 2022 we have 359 followers - an increase of 12% from 2021. Our growth has been slow on this platform, but our audience is sharing our content with their networks and we are reaching a wider audience!

## Director and Rep Bios

This year, we launched a “get to know you” series on Facebook and Instagram highlighting our amazing camp directors and TCF reps. This initiative received the highest engagement across both platforms month after month. We shared bios from directors at every camp, and showcased our TCF reps in nearly every state! Our social media audiences loved seeing their camp directors featured on our channels and enjoyed getting to know the TCF reps in their states.

## Celebrated Our 30th Anniversary

This year, we celebrated 30 years of camp-passion during our 30th Anniversary! You saw changes made to the TCF logo to represent 30 years of camp-passion, as well as changes to our marketing materials and branding across the TCF website and print marketing. We also shared the love on social media, highlighting all the ways to show camp-passion, sharing gratitude from campers big and small, and inviting alumni to share their favorite camp stories.



## Campership Day of Giving

Our First Annual Campership Day of Giving campaign was very successful! One day of giving turned into a successful MONTH of giving! Between donations and incentives, we were able to take advantage of the entire \$80,000 match given by a generous donor. We received a total of \$135,000 in funds including the match. This is \$35,000 over last year's spring campaign. Of this, we sent \$25,026 to the camps. We had 55 people donate to the camps through us and TCF gained 50 new donors of our own and three new monthly donors.

## Church Matches

For the first time this year, we launched a dollar-for-dollar matching initiative just for churches! Thanks to a generous donor, a \$30,000 match was introduced to the churches in January. The churches jumped at the opportunity and the match was met within a matter of weeks. In August, a donor reignited the incentive with a generous \$50,000 match! In total, TCF raised over \$62,000 in gifts from Christian Science churches and societies through this initiative.

## Saying Goodbye to Marina

It is with much gratitude that we say goodbye to Marina (Whitney) King. As the Marketing Coordinator for The Campership Fund for the last two years she has been instrumental in getting our social media up and running, introducing creative new ways to market our fundraising efforts, and elevating our monthly newsletters. ## 30 YEARS OF CAMP PASSION

**1992**

TCF Started in Georgia in 1992. We sent 20 kids to camp with \$8,185 in campership awards.

**2012**

In 2012 TCF moved out to the Midwest with campership awards to 92 kids totaling \$66,000.

**2020**

Became the primary funding source for all the camps for camperships. Opened up funding for families & adult programs. Supported campers in all 50 states. TCF Reps in almost all states.

**2009**

By 2009 we added campers from NC, SC & FL. We were supporting about 52 campers a year and were providing around \$43,000 in campership awards.

**2019**

TCF added staff and focused on outreach. We supported 585 kids with awards totaling \$819,000. We were now in all 37 states. Formed an Outreach Program.

**2022**

Celebrated 30 years. Largest gain in campers and awards to date for 945 kids and adults with awards totaling \$1,262,000. 1st Campership Day of Giving. 1992 Legacy Society created.

We're delighted to be in our 30th year and grateful for all the growth that's taken place during this time. One way this growth is measured is by the number of camperships given out each year—yet more importantly, it's seen in the impact it has in the lives of the campers who have been helped. In "30 Years of Camp Gratitude" on pages 16-19 you'll see evidences of how the camp experiences of individual campers throughout the years have touched their lives ... like the grandson's from 2013.

Another measure of growth is the increase in the amount given out in awards—and is evident in the increased generosity of our donors who provide their financial support because they value our mission. And it's because of these donors that so many children have been blessed with the camp experience!

In total, TCF has awarded \$4,747,575 to 4,221 campers over the 30 years. Approximately 69% of this growth has taken place in the past five years as we expanded throughout the US and Canada in order to assure families that funding was available for all those who needed help.
