A Story of Growth this Year!

More than any other year, The Campership Fund grew to bless others. Here are some of the ways we grew along with the blessings it meant for others in our CS camp community.

Expanded Mission – Added Family Camp

After 27 years, we offered camperships for children attending Family Camp. This helped 46 children attend the various Family Camps.

Expanded Coverage – Added 22 States

In 2019, The Campership Fund provided financial support to bless families in 37 states and the District of Columbia-more than double in size from 2018.


Increased Campership Awards

In 2019, we removed the limits on the award someone can receive. Previously families could receive up to 75% of tuition up to \$1,500 per child. Families can

now receive funding up to 75% of the total tuition for camp. This is a huge help for those attending more than one week of camp.


270% increase in campership funding

Here's a glimpse of what a donation will provide:

- \$75 an afternoon of sailing,

\$819,000 in campership funding helped 585 children attend camp in 2019.

This would not have been possible without the generous support of those who understand the value of these camps.

Outreach Program

One of the most significant improvements to The Campership Fund was the formation of our Outreach Program.

This new program has two purposes: (1) to develop a network of volunteers throughout the United States who love the camps for Christian Scientists and are passionate about helping others learn about them; and (2) to provide information about these camps to others through TCF Outreach Events where an all-camp video is shared.

Our Network Of 2019 Volunteers – TCF Representatives

Jack Kavanagh recently joined our team as Outreach Director to help enlarge our network of volunteer Representatives and train them.

Representatives are our boots-on-the-ground. They reach into their churches and Sunday Schools nationwide to assure that church families know about the camps for Christian Scientists and that funding is available through TCF. They represent TCF at camp shows and host virtual camp shows. And they vet our applicants to determine a family's financial need and recommend solutions. We could not assist local Christian Science families without them.

There truly is a camp program for everyone.

Each camp provides:

- Summer Camp for children from June through August offering activities such as waterskiing, sailing, mountain biking, rafting, horsemanship, team sports, kayaking, etc.
- reunions during this time while enjoying all the activities camp has to offer.
- These are wonderful for families, individuals and friends.



And although they are different, they all share the common foundation of Loverooted in the daily practice and application of Christian Science.

These visits helped us establish relationships with camp administrators, learn more about each camp and their outreach strategies, and gain a clearer understanding of how TCF can support the camps throughout

Did you know?

- Camp Bow-Isle spent their first summer camping in repurposed circus tents! And, surprisingly boasts the shortest commute of all the camps to/from a major airport.
- Camp Newfound for Girls is the oldest of the camps (est. 1914) and their brother camp, Owatonna, used to be called 'ROPIOA' (Reflections Of Perfection Is Our Aim).
- ► A/U Ranches helped develop the first professional standards for commercial whitewater rafting in the 1980s. Pretty rad!
- At Crystal Lake Camps, close to half of the campers and staff come from outside the United States. During our visit, all announcements were given in three different languages!

• Off-season Programs during the fall and winter with a variety of themes—Christmas or Winter camp, Bible Study, Military Weekend, Women's Weekend, Creative Arts Week, etc.

- CedarS Camps' boasts a number of natural caves-including one that became the site of an archaeological dig that turned up a number of Native American artifacts.
- Camps Leelanau and Kohahna are situated within the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore, surrounded by preserved historic pioneer homes from the late 1800s.

Camper Connor and Mom (Susan) – CedarS

Connor attended CedarS Camps on his own for the first time this past summer-something he was feeling a bit nervous about! Over his two-week session, he was able to step outside of his comfort zone, try new activities he couldn't do at home, and make new friends who also practice Christian Science.

"I am very grateful that I got the opportunity to have this great experience. I enjoyed having the chance to do fun activities such as kayaking, horseback riding, or caving, that I can't do at home. At camp I got to be a part of a cabin and make new friends. I was glad to have the practitioner talks in the morning, and the CS atmosphere was very good."

His mother, Susan, was nearby for the first week of Connor's session while she worked as a parent volunteer. Connor felt he was ready to stay for the second week of camp on his own, which was a big step! Susan shared how grateful she was that Connor was able to express more independence.

"I know firsthand what a pivotal role camp

can play in helping children learn to rely on Christian Science as they grow up. I am so touched and immensely grateful that the Campership Fund is making it possible for young Christian Scientists to have this experience."
